*As noted in "A History of Corinna, "In 1804, Dr. John Warren of Boston purchased 'Township Number Four in the Fourth Range of Townships North of the Waldo Patent in the County of Somerset, District of Maine'; now known as Corinna. Soon after, Dr. Warren sent Samuel Lancey, Esq. to bush out a road near the center of the township east and west, giving him in exchange for his labor 170 acres of land, providing he should erect a house and barn thereon. Lancey fulfilled his contract and built his log cabin home at Corinna Center on land afterwards owned by Jacob Philbrick and Winkworth Allen. This barn was afterwards used for religious meetings until the erection of a school house."*

*Lancey would assist the townspeople in establishing their town and called by warrant for the first Town Meeting in 1816 and was the moderator. It appears they sold the Corinna homestead soon after it was built and removed to Palmyra by C/1810. He built a large tavern on the stage road from Norridgewock to Bangor, a duplicate of their Chelmsford home. He was a Justice of the Peace of Palmyra in 1819, the Palmyra delegate to the 1819 Maine Constitutional Convention and Post Master of Palmyra in 1828. As noted above, he was also an early surveyor and builder of roads for Corinna, Palmyra and Hartland beginning in 1804 when he first arrived.*

*Elizabeth is the granddaughter of Robert Pierce, who in 1724 was a member of the Chelmsford "Snowshoe Company" under command of Capt. Robert Richardson in Lovewell's Indian Expedition. The Elizabeth Pierce Lancey Chapter of the D.A.R. of Pittsfield, organized on November 2, 1916, was named in her honor.*

*The territory comprising the West Precinct of the town of Chelmsford was set off September 23, 1729 and constituted a distinct and separate township by the name of Westford.*

Paterson as having passed muster in a return dated Camp Totoway, Oct. 25, 1780; also, pay roll for 6 months men raised by the town of Chelmsford for service in the Continental Army at North river during 1780; marched from home Jun 30, 1780; discharged Dec. 19, 1780; service, 6 mos., including 10 days (200 miles) travel home.

*As noted by the Pittsfield Historical Society, "In 1824 Col. William Lancey removed to Pittsfield from Palmyra and soon opened a store at his residence. In May 1828 he was licensed to retail spirits for four months, and the following September he was licensed to be an inn holder at his dwelling house at the corner of Easy Street and Main Street, known as the 'Lancey Hotel'. In 1839, William K. Lancey, son of William Lancey, began trading at the age of eighteen. The inn was managed in succession by William Lancey, Susanne Lancey (William's widow), and finally by his eldest son, Isaac H. Lancey. In 1868, Isaac H. Lancey built, at a cost of \$15,000, the famous 'Lancey House' at the corner of Hunnewell Avenue and Main Street. The Lancey Hotel became the residence of the Lancey Family."*

*She arrived from Scotland in NYC on December 9, 1864 on the “Caledonia” at 3 yrs old with her father and siblings. G.M. Lancey was a successful merchant from about 1889 to 1920 at the corner of Commercial & Main Street where he took over the business operated there by his father, George Lancey, Jr.. His dry goods store was also the location of Hartland's first bank as well as the original location of the Hartland Public Library. He would later sell insurance from his home on Academy Street, the first house on the left. He sold his business to his store manager, Bertie Hanson and her son Maurice, in 1920 who converted it into B. W. Hanson & Son Clothing Store. **(See Hanson Family)** He was also very active in town affairs and served on the committee to sell the former Linn Woolen Mill location eventually purchased by the American Woolen Mill. He would often make boat trips up to Harmony Castle on Moose Pond to bring the guests needed supplies.*

*He operated the Hartland Drug Store from about 1877 until they left town. He was also the Post Master and Town Clerk of Hartland. They moved to Woonsocket, South Dakota along with her mother, Clarinda in 1885 soon after they married. Alden resumed his druggist profession and was appointed Post Master of Woonsocket on January 16, 1890.*

*3 of Alden's older brothers were with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Maine, Company E and were all Killed in Action within 3 months of enlisting. Cyrus on 21 July 1861 at the Battle of Bull Run; Gustavus on 8 Sep 1861 at Georgetown and George on 17 Sep 1861 at Alexandria, Virginia.*

*"Woonsocket was developed in 1883 as a railroad town because of its location at the junction of the Chicago, Milwaukee and Santa Fe Railroads. C.H. Prior, the superintendent of the railroad, named the town after his home town of Woonsocket, Rhode Island. The town was incorporated in 1888."*
