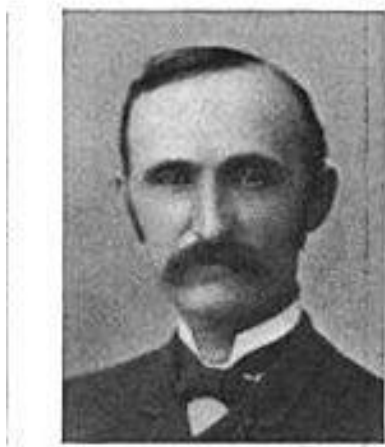

They had no children as noted on C/1900 (0 children born, 0 children living)

*His Grandparents settled in Palmyra in the 1830s. Albert moved to Hartland from Palmyra where he had lived with his parents soon after C/1860 and is living there in C/1870 in the Johnson Household with his occupation noted as "Apothecary". He opened a drug store around 1877 called A. W. Miller Drugs & Medicines on Main Street and was a boarder in the William Stevens household on Pittsfield Avenue in C/1880. He would move his business across the street to the Hartland Drug Store (Nettie's) location in the late 1880s before returning back to the original Main Street location in the early 1900s. One of his druggists working for him was Ralph C. Hamilton who would later operate the Hartland Drug Store. Albert was an active member in town affairs serving as a Selectman, Liquor Agent, Probate Judge and a Maine State Representative. He was also a member of the committee to build the Town Hall. As late as 1915 at the age of 79, he was still running his drug store business where they lived upstairs. Myra moved to Hubbard Avenue after C/1920 living there by C/1930 at 65 yrs old. They are interred in the Miller Family Plot with his nephew, Benjamin Israel Miller and his wife, Ada Marie Seekins of St Albans.*
